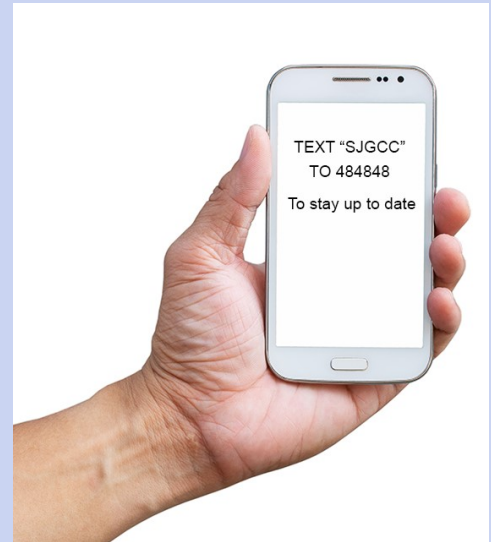

How to Make Cake Pops (the easy way)

Prep Time 1 hour Cook Time 35 minutes

Servings 30 servings

Ingredients

1 box of Cake Mix

All the ingredients called for on the box of cake mix

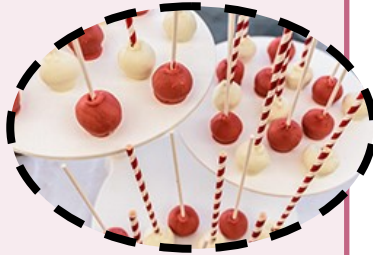
1 can of Frosting

Sticks for the Cake Pops

Target and Michaels both sell them

About 2 1/4 cups Melting Chocolate or Almond Bark

Nonpareils or Sprinkles or other decorations



Instructions:

Start by preparing a cake using the cake mix and following the instructions on the box. Bake the cake and let it cool. Save the box from the cake mix - you will need this later.

In a large bowl, combine the cake and the frosting, gradually adding the frosting until the cake pops are moist and easy to form into balls.

Freeze the cake balls. You need to freeze the cake balls, otherwise, they will break up when you dip them in the melted chocolate. Freeze the cake balls for at least 2 hours.

Before you melt the chocolate, take the box from the cake mix and use a knife to gently poke small holes in the box. You will be placing the cake pops in the holes while the chocolate dries.

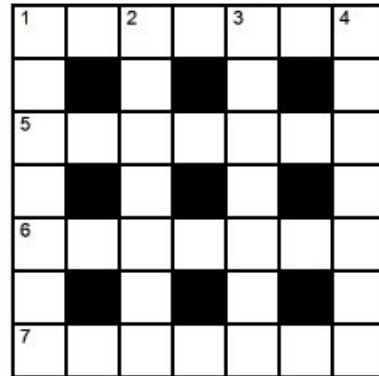
Melt about 2 cups of melting chocolate or almond bark. It works well to melt it in a mug placed in the microwave.

Dunk the cake pops in the melted chocolate, shake off the excess and roll the cakes balls into the decorations

Carefully place the cake pops in the box to dry. Once the chocolate sets it is time to eat!

You can also press the cake mixture into a rectangle on parchment paper and use cookie cutters to cut shapes before dipping.

If you do not want to use sticks, you can use small cupcake papers. All supplies can be bought at Michael's, Joannes or any craft supply store



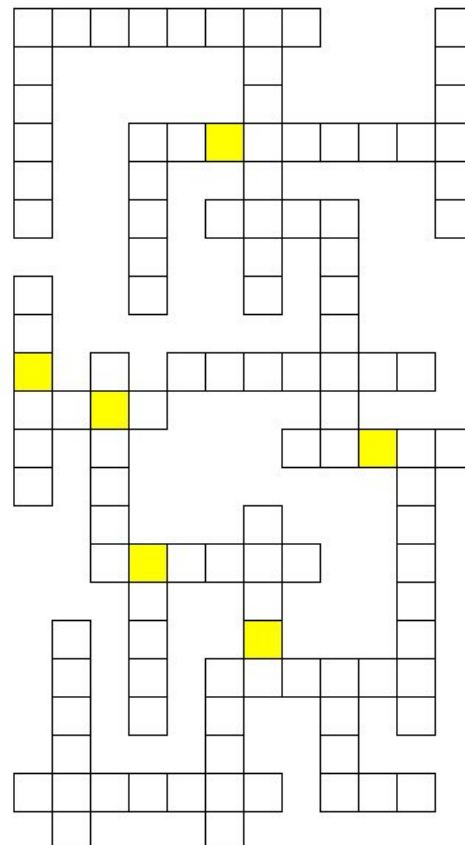

This month, our focus is on improving neighborhood lighting for all you early morning joggers (kudos!) and (yes) even you late night party revelers (kudos to you too because I'm usually in bed). With that in mind, I wanted to let you know that FPL will be receiving our neighborhood feedback and a street diagram on where you guys have indicated you would like to see additional street poles. **A huge shout out to all who provided feedback on this project.** I am excited to have this move forward.



Maintenance and Operations has also turned in a list of leaning street poles (Thanks, Irma!) to be uprighted. Most of these are located in the Cross Point / Stonehedge section of the neighborhood, so if you are in the area, please know that this has an open work ticket and you should see this being addressed shortly.

Speaking of FPL: **DID YOU KNOW?**

If you notice a street light out, you can report it in one of 2 ways:

You can inform the amenities manager (**Jessica Maher @ 904-599-9093 – she's new! Welcome aboard Jessica!**) and give her the number that is located on the pole. This number will identify the street lamp's location and it is easier for FPL to address. That way, if there are 2 street poles at the location, FPL can know exactly which one you are referring to. If the number has worn off over time (and some have), a location such as "in front of house 1234 on Main Street" will work.

You can also call FPL directly yourself to report the outage. The number is 1-800-226-3545.

And finally, the take aways:

You will be happy to know that the neighborhood watch is now over 300 members strong. Not a bad percentage for a year and a half's work!

Thankfully, our neighborhood watch has escaped the round of budget cuts and our budget for 2019 will remain the same at \$0. All who participate are happy to provide this value added service to all residents for the price of a hearty handshake, a round of thanks and an occasional shout out on social media.

62% of men are expected to by a gift for a loved one compared to 45% of women.

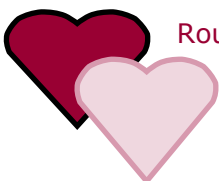
Husbands spend 73.5% more on their wives than wives spend on their husbands.

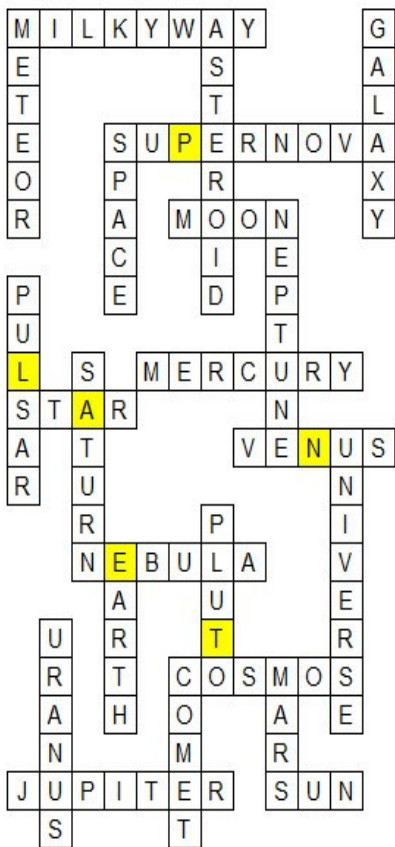

About February

The 2nd month of the year brings us George Washington's Birthday, Valentine's Day, and the shortest month of the year.

In the Gregorian calendar, the calendar that most of the world uses, February is the second month of the year. Most of the months have 30 or 31 days in a month but February is shorter. February has 28 days until Julius Caesar gave it 29 and 30 days every four years. This is because the Roman emperor Augustus took one day from February and added that to August because August was a month that was named after him. February is a very cold month followed by January in the northern half of the world. However, there are sunny days in February that indicates that spring is almost here. Different from the northern half, the southern hemisphere usually enjoys midsummer weather.

Below are some fun facts about February:

- ◇ The birthstone for February is Amethyst.
- ◇ Two zodiac signs for February are Aquarius (January 20 - February 18) and Pisces (February 19 - March 20)
- ◇ The month has 29 days in leap years, when the year number is divisible by four. In common years the month has 28 days.
- ◇ Viola (plant) and the Primrose are the birth flowers.
- ◇ Black History Month is celebrated in Canada and United States.
- ◇ On February 4, 1861, a temporary committee met at Montgomery, Alabama where they organized a Confederate States of America.
- ◇ On February 6, 1933, Amendment 20 to the United States was proclaimed which moved the Inauguration Day to January 20th.
- ◇ National Heart Awareness Month.
- ◇ In February 1910, the Boy Scouts of America was incorporated.
- ◇ On February 6, 1899. The U.S. Senate ratified the peace treaty that led to the end of the Spanish-American War.
- ◇ On February 6, 1952, Princess Elizabeth became Queen Elizabeth II of Great Britain.
- ◇ February 18 - Presidents' Day
- ◇ February 14 - Valentine's Day
